Signs Along the Way

Keeping Our Hearts Aligned with the Heart of God

I've been giving a lot of thought lately to the concept of trusting my heart or my head. There are many messages in society today to "follow your heart" no matter the circumstances. These mes-

sages come at us from marketing, movies, novels, slogans, blogs and memes (everywhere). Related bits of advice are "trust yourself" and "follow your instincts." Stated another way, "your heart will never lead you astray."

My personal struggle is that when I allow my heart to lead in decision making, I feel like I'm granting myself permission to ignore facts and logic, leading me to decisions not supported by biblical truth. So, full disclosure – I really struggle with bad eating habits and failure to exercise as much as I should. In my own way, I'm following my heart, because I don't want to discipline myself and follow God's truth about caring for the temple that is my body.

So, how do I get myself aligned with the heart of God in this matter – or any matter?

Here are the ways I plan to work on this:

First, pray daily about my need to align with God. Some verses I'll rely on:

Proverbs 3:5–6 This passage gives an explicit command not to trust ourselves. And it gives the promise of guidance to those who choose to follow the Lord.

Jeremiah 17:7 God has perfect knowledge of everything.

1 John 3:20 A trait often called omniscience. God's knowledge is not limited in any way. God is aware of all events that have ever transpired, are currently occurring, and will ever happen.

Isaiah 46:9–10 God's knowledge goes beyond mere events and extends to thoughts and intentions.

John 2:25; Acts 1:24 It is not all this knowledge, however, that makes God a perfectly reliable source of guidance. God is also aware of every possibility, every eventuality, every imaginable outcome of any series of events.

Matthew 11:21 That ability, combined with God's goodness, enables God to give the best possible direction for people to follow.

Seek God's will for my life.

Ask for support and help.

Offer support and help to others I know who share the same struggle.

We have an omniscient, benevolent Lord who promises to give us wisdom. We should gratefully take it!


James 1:5 We have His inspired, inerrant Word written down for us.

2 Timothy 3:16 Why would we turn our backs on God and His eternal promises in order to pursue the whimsical impulses of the heart?




