
# A Summer of Growth; A Fall of Harvest

## A Note from Rev. Chambers

## Signs Along the Way

Several months ago, I came across an unfortunate sight. I discovered a rocking chair that had been abandoned and earmarked for the trash heap. Many of you may not be aware of this, but I have a certain affinity for woodworking and craftsmanship. Kathryn and I over the course of our marriage have built numerous pieces of fur-



niture that adorn our home. We enjoy the process of envisioning what can be. Where others may see an old worn-out broken chair, we see the possibility of new life and a new creation.

When I discovered this rocking chair, I knew that it still had life and a story to tell. Yes, I saw the dents, the scratches, the chips in the wood, all evidence of use and a lifetime of love. Yes, I even saw the broken parts. The parts where the wood was splintered and would need to be repaired. What others might see as a waste of time; I saw as an opportunity to bring new life to this rocking chair's story.

So, I got to work. First disassembling the rocking chair. Parts of it came apart easily, other parts took some motivation and some strong whacks of the mallet. A few pieces even broke as they were disassembled. Upon being broken down to the essences of the pieces, the hard work began. Each piece, that had been handspun countless years ago needed to be stripped and sanded down to the grain of the wood. Once the pieces and parts were raw like my hands, it was time to breathe new life into this creation. It wasn't easy, it wasn't perfect, but the results were worth the journey.

The story of this rocking chair is in many ways a metaphor for our life. We begin life fresh and new ready to face any challenge and conquer the world. Fairly quickly along the way we begin to pick up scratches, dents, chips, and broken pieces. Maybe we even come to the point where we feel like we belong on the trash heap. But here is the difference between us and the rocking chair. God is always watching out for you.

We read these words in Isiah 43:19, "Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

When we are at our lowest point, God is present to us. Perhaps the journey to this point is to allow us to be mendable and ready for the hands of the master carpenter, to call us into new being and new creation. Don't give up hope. Don't give up on God. Don't give up on yourself. For it may just be that you are going through a process and a journey of restoration that will bring you into new life. We don't know where life's journey will lead us. We do know, we can find rest in the promises of God.

As is recorded in Jeremiah 31:3 "Thus has said the Lord God from on high: I have loved you with an everlasting love; with loving kindness I have drawn and knit you unto me."

These are the promises of our faith. These are the promises of our God.

The old rocking chair has found new life and a new purpose too. As after the first of the coming year, that rocking chair will hold Kathryn or myself as we hold God's second greatest gift to us in our arms, as we welcome our second child into this world. Behold, God is doing something new. God is showing us, His Everlasting Love!


## Pizza with the Pastor




