Signs Along the Way



This afternoon as I sat in my office I paused for a time and watched the snow gently fall from the sky. Growing up in Kansas before moving to Texas in High School, I remember many snow days during the winter months. Though, admittedly the amount of snow that we have had over the last week or so, is by far the most snow I've seen in my life. If you drove by the Church this week you may have noticed the following words on our Church Sign:

"Jesus Loves you SNOW Much!"

We put this on the sign before the record snowfall and there is a part of me that wants to change the sign to read: "Okay, it's time to quit praying for Snow."

The reality is, that God does love us Snow much. The psalmist records these words in the 147th Psalm: "He gives snow like wool; he scatters frost like ashes. He hurls down his crystals of ice like crumbs; who can stand before his cold?"

Now, I don't think the psalmist was talking specifically about our snow fall but the words fit. The psalmist is talking about how nature (the seasons, weather changes, snow) reveals God's design and God's love. It is winter that is a springboard into new life. Without the dormant days of rest and recovery- new life wouldn't be ready to spring forth when the warmth of the sun returns. So, while we may look at the snow and be ready for it to melt, know that is because of the snow, new life will come soon. Know that God loves you Snow much!

WE SERVE BETTER TOGETHER

As we transition into a new year, it's a common practice to make plans for the future. We do this as individuals, as families, and as a church. As I considered this process as it pertains to the mission of Noelridge Christian Church, I turned to a devotional by Rick Warren titled, <u>Better Together</u>. In this devotional Rick points out that as we serve in our churches we especially need each other and that we belong to each other in the Body of Christ. I've listed some of his thoughts below on how we might serve God better together at NCC during 2024.

We serve God when we serve other people. Whenever we use our talents, time, energy, and resources to help other people, that's called ministry. But God doesn't want us to minister alone. In Philippians 2:2, Paul advises, "Make me truly happy by agreeing wholeheartedly with each other, loving one another and working together with one mind and purpose."

Why do we serve better together? Because we're family, because we need each other, and because we get more done. 1 Corinthians 3:9 says, "We are co-workers in God's service." If you're in God's family, God wants you to get along with other family members. We also need each other as we serve so we can be more productive. Nobody has all the talents or all the gifts to serve his or her best. Romans 12:5 states, "Each of us finds our meaning and function as part of [Christ's] body." And, teamwork multiplies effectiveness as pointed out in Ecclesiastes 4:9, "Two are better off than one, because together they can work more effectively."

God wants to use us in ways we may never have expected. We each have something to offer, but we don't have enough on our own. That's why we need other people in our lives. God wants to use us, but He also wants to use us in a team where we help each other out.

God wired us so we feel most alive when we're part of a team that's accomplishing something for His kingdom. Teams cause us to get closer to each other, to get more done, and to have more fun. When you get together for an eternal purpose, it builds an unstoppable team that can accomplish great things for God.

I think God has big plans for NCC for 2024. God wants to work in us and through us so we can share His blessings and love with others. As we embark on accomplishing His plans, let's commit to serve better together.



We know that we all grieve in different ways, so for those who would find it helpful, we will have a prayer service to remember Cameron and give thanks for the many gifts he shared with us over several years.

Member Care Ministry

Under the auspices of Congregational Life Program Group, Noelridge is rolling out a new ministry to help coordinate assistance for the needs of our church family. Theresa Smith, Linda Fisher, and Trudy Stewart will be the primary coordinators. The idea is to have a consistent way to receive information about needs of our church family members and match them with another member of our church family who can assist them.

We are now organizing a group of volunteers to care for church members with needs for assistance. Examples of assistance that could be provided include rides to church activities, medical appointments, or for simple errands; providing meals during times of illness, personal losses, or recovery from surgery or childbirth; light, temporary, help around the house; light moving assistance (boxes and small furniture); sitting with a family member while a caregiver goes to an appointment or runs an errand; or providing helpful information on current health or safety issues. Other options may be a telephone tree to check on members in times of bad weather or writing cheery notes to homebound people to help keep them in touch with their church family.

There are some limitations in the services provided due to licensure or safety issues. We have volunteers with medical backgrounds, but we will not be doing medical advising or care that should be done by a licensed medical professional. We will not be a heavy moving company, nor a continuous lawn care or housekeeping service.

We will be reaching out to all church members, encouraging them to volunteer to help within their capabilities. Start thinking about how you could help one of our members.
