A Message From Our Pastor

Dear Congregation,

"I am delighted to see you!" Imagine how it would feel if each person you met at worship, at your next family gathering, or even in your neighborhood, greeted you with those words. Wouldn't it feel great?!

When Jesus met his friends at the Sea of Galilee (Tiberias), shortly after his resurrection, he had an interesting exchange with Simon Peter (see John 21). Peter had denied him three times and Jesus asks him three times, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" To which Peter responds, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." And then Jesus responds by asking Peter to feed and care for his sheep. I suspect that God desires for each of us to care for his sheep as well.

Who are those sheep?

Every human being is created in the Image of God. That image, although stained by sin, remains with us. The image is restored through Christ Jesus and as we are sanctified the reflection of God within us becomes clearer.

God's sheep are all around us. When we care for each other, we are expressing our love for God.

On November 5th (and in the days prior) we will be going to the polls to elect, among other roles, a new president. And in the days following, we will be responding to the results of that election. We will also be gathering as the people of God for prayer and worship. We will be interacting with our neighbors, coworkers, and friends online and in person. And not long after, we will be gathering with loved ones, who may not have voted as we did, to celebrate Thanksgiving and then Christmas.

Imagine if in all those gatherings, "I am delighted to see you!" graced our lips. "How do we do this?" you might ask. It begins with focusing on joy. Before you meet someone, take time to recall a memory you have of or with that person that brings you joy. If you are struggling with this, pray about it and ask God to bring something to mind. Then consider one or more ways you can give thanks to God for that person. When you do meet, ask others, "What brings you joy?" or "What is one of your favorite memories of our time together?" As you reminisce about these things, you will be able to look at each other and say, "I am delighted to see you!"

This practice can also be integrated here at church. When we greet one another as brothers and sisters in Christ it is good for us to express our delight in seeing each other. If we are struggling to do so, then it is good for us to remember the times that have brought us joy and to take a moment to recognize the image of God in each other.

For Your Information - This is the Covenant Agreement for Rev. Stasia Fine and NCC

Principle Functions and Goals

Be a Godly example to the congregation through prayer, knowledge of the scriptures, and demonstrating God's love through word and deed

Provide spiritual leadership of the church through planned worship services, support for educational, fellowship and outreach ministries, and cooperative work with lay persons and staff to set a vision for our ministry and church programs

Shepherd and care for the congregation through open communication, visitation, and administering official pastoral functions of the church (e.g. - weddings, funerals, baptisms)

Responsibilities of the Position

Worship and Teaching

Plan and deliver sermons as the primary leader of worship services

Coordinate with church volunteers and staff to provide meaningful worship through music, prayer, teaching, communion, and fellowship

Provide leadership and assistance in planning and executing educational programs, coordinating planning with church volunteers and staff

Congregational Care

Oversee the pastoral care needs of the congregation, coordinating with the Elders to visit those needing pastoral care at home

Establish regular office hours and be reasonably available during those times

Provide pastoral counseling or counseling referrals when appropriate

Be reasonably available to the congregation for medical or personal emergencies where pastoral care may be needed, or coordinating with the Elders if unavailable

Leadership and Planning

Support strategic planning and staff/volunteer coordination and execution of church ministries
Plan and coordinate staff meetings as needed to foster open communication in planning and delivery
of ministry programs

Be reasonably available to participate at the steering board meetings and with the functional teams of the church (at least once/year)

Additional Considerations for this Covenant Agreement

Initially, this will be a part time position from about September 2024 through May 2025 with mutual consideration to extend the ministry beyond May 2025.

Recognizing the special need for balance between work and family, the pastor will be evaluated based upon the quality of service, rather than the quantity of service (hours), and we will hold our pastor accountable to faithfulness to God's calling, as well as spiritual fruitfulness born from time with God and care of congregation.

The church recognizes the importance of respite time and family time and will work with the pastor to take time off and, as necessary, additional time off to meet family obligations. The separate benefit agreement will include specific vacation time.

There will be scheduled opportunities for the pastor and the chosen leadership to re-evaluate the pastorcongregation relationship and set a vision for the future. These meetings are different than a professional review, as the purpose is for mutual conversation and visioning on the behalf of the congregation.

Caring for the dying, grieving, and officiating funeral services are a place of ministerial giftedness for our pastor. As this takes a lot of time and spiritual energy, the pastor will work with the elders in advance to create a plan to fill the pulpit on Sundays when the pastor is officiating multiple funeral services within the same week.

As a clergy person, the pastor has the right to refer or refuse officiating any marriage ceremony. This includes if the reason being given is a personal conflict in expressing integrity with his/her beliefs about marriage (e.g. - if a couple wants to have a service that is irreverent towards God or there are signs of substance or other abuse issues).

As Noelridge Christian Church is this pastor's home and ordaining congregation, the normal ethical guidelines for the relationship between clergy and a former church will not apply in this relationship after the completion of the call to serve as pastor at Noelridge Christian Church. Also, the church and pastor will both strive to close the ministerial relationship with gratitude, love and dignity.

Elder Moment

From Paul's letter to the Ephesians, chapter 4, verses 1 – 6

As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit – just as you were called to one hope when you were called – one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

When very young, I was taught a poem where I would lace my fingers together, then point my index fingers up, then move my thumbs out and then turn my hands with fingers up while saying, "Here is the church, here is the steeple, open the doors and see all the people!" If someone had asked me what a church was, I probably would have said that it's a building with high ceilings, lots of places to sit, many small rooms for kids to have Sunday School, and a bell tower with a steeple on it. It wasn't until I was twelve and away at a week of church camp that I learned that God's church isn't a building — it's the people inside. (So, go straight to the fingers sticking up - "Here is the church!")

In early high school, my Sunday School classmates and I were taken to a few other churches in town to experience their Sunday morning worship services. Having always attended the same church denomination, it was eye-opening to learn that not everyone worships in the same way. However, in all but one of the churches we visited, there was a touchstone in common – the Lord's Prayer. Regardless of whether we sang liturgy or spoke responsively, stood up or sat down for listening to Bible readings, kneeled, stood or sat for prayer, stayed silent during sermons or felt free to comment (Amen!), applauded after a musical offering or remained silent in respectful contemplation, the Lord's Prayer tied us all together. The Lord's Prayer marked us as fellow believers in God, our heavenly Father who provides for us and gives us grace, and as believers in Jesus, God's Son who gave His life that we may live eternally.

That Sunday School church visitation experience showed me that not only is "church" not just a building – it isn't even limited to the people in that building. God's church includes all who love Him, all who feel a calling to Him and want to respond to that call, whether or not they happen to spend time in a building with us or in any building with a "bell tower and a steeple."

We have a responsibility to pray for, encourage and uphold each other in God's love here at Noelridge. We also have that same responsibility to God's church in the world. Blessings, Karen

This year, we'll be joining several area churches for a Thanksgiving Eve Service at 7 pm on Wednesday, November 27, at The Church on Northland at 5200 Northland Ave, NE in Cedar Rapids. Come celebrate a special time together.

Week of Compassion Emergency Appeal

On Thursday, Sept. 26, Hurricane Helene made landfall, tracking across six states, with rain reaching into several more. Destruction is estimated at \$160 billion. WoC has been in contact with regional ministers and has been working with DCEF to provide support. The greatest need is for financial contributions. 100% of all contributions designated Hurricane 2024 will go directly to these responses.

Week of Compassion is collaborating with colleagues at Disciples Church Extension Fund to provide support for Christmount and congregations that sustained building damage from Hurricane Helene, and is engaging ecumenical partners to assess needs, determine immediate responses, and prepare for what will surely be a significant long-term recovery. Children's Disaster Services has deployed a team to North Carolina; and in partnership with Crisis CleanUp, virtual volunteers are staffing call centers to connect storm survivors and resources.
