A Note From Our Pastor

Dear Church Family,

Christmas Eve is the night we celebrate heaven and earth meeting. We recall the stories of witnesses who saw Glory and humility meet. We repeat stories about angels with shepherds, wise men with an infant, and hospitality being offered in unexpected places. Our celebration of Christmas can draw us into a place of wonder as we see streams of decorative lights amidst the bleak cold of a dark winter night. Christmas may be a time of gift giving and receiving, sharing of a meal, singing carols, festive decorating, and church attendance. Or it may be a time of solitude with a single lit candle, an open Bible, and a simple meal.

While holiday celebrations often emphasize the joyous, there are times in our lives where we may feel a greater connection with the pain and sorrow of this event: the young virgin woman giving birth to her first child, the anxiety and expense of travel for those coming for the census, and later the families mourning the death of their toddlers killed by King Herod in his futile search for the newborn Jewish king.

This is a season filled with much emotion. The church calls it Advent and recognizes the weeks preparing for Christmas Day as the beginning of the church calendar. During Advent, the church recalls the hundreds of years of waiting that took place, as people longed for the coming of the Messiah. It is also a time when, we, the church look forward to that Messiah's future return. In between we are reminded of the ways that the Kingdom of God is already here in a call to care for the sick, visit the imprisoned, release those bound by sin, and feed the hungry. It is a time for showing mercy and advocating for justice. It is a time we renew our commitment to representing God's grace in the world.

Church family, I wonder, how do we remember in our actions and in our meditations that this is a holy season? How do we use this time to prepare our hearts and our homes for the Christ?

Let us ponder these questions and respond to God's invitation however that may look in our lives.

Christmas Joys to All and Happy Winter!

God created such a beautiful and diverse world: terrain, flora, fauna, climate, peoples, and cultures. What a wondrous masterpiece! What He created for us here in Iowa is no exception. Our piece of the world's diversity includes a climate of four seasonal weather patterns as well as weather patterns that change from day to day, hour to hour, and sometimes in a matter of 5 minutes. Each season has its own blessings and joys, as well as its challenges. Our piece of diversity includes fertile land perfect for growing crops and raising animals to help feed ourselves and others.

In spring, the earth grows green again and the flowers and trees bloom; crops are planted; and wildlife and our farm animals reproduce to carry on the species and provide more food. We start spending more time outside as the daylight hours grow longer.

During the summer the crops continue to grow, the animals grow and fatten, and the trees and plants grow and produce their seeds. We spend our summer in a myriad of activities, spending much time outdoors enjoying the warm weather.

Then fall comes and we harvest what we have raised. The trees and plants release their seeds and leaves and go dormant to rest for the winter. We start our migration back indoors and the daylight hours grow shorter.

In winter God puts our land to rest and the animals to hibernate, or slow down to rest. He places us under a cold blanket of snow to remind us that the earth needs a time for physical rest and so do we.

Matthew 11:28 "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." Instead of dreading the winter or feeling homebound and restless, this may be a good time to pattern our lives after what God has done with the outdoor world. Take time to rest, recuperate, regenerate, and reengage with those in the household. Enjoy your indoor hobbies, visit with friends, or listen to music! Spend time reading devotionals, praying, and meditating. Sort out what is important to you and your faith, regarding Christmas and make that your priority, leaving behind some of the unnecessary hustle bustle. Did you know that if you read one chapter of the Gospel of Luke each day starting Dec 1, by Christmas Eve you will have read Luke's entire gospel and taken in the true meaning of Christmas.

Chill out (literally and figuratively) and enjoy the winter so when spring comes you are rested, refreshed, and ready to bloom again both physically and spiritually! Wishing you and your loved ones a wonderful Advent journey to Bethlehem and a Blessed Christmas.

Physical Resources News

It has been a busy year for the Physical Resources Team. From moving lots of snow to mowing the lawn, the volunteers have done a phenomenal job of keeping Noelridge Christian Church in great condition as a place for us to worship our Lord and Savior. Many tasks have been done this year and there is always more to be done on a weekly and monthly basis. It's just like at home –never ending but many hands make the work lighter. **God has blessed our church members with many talents and it is estimated they have donated over 1,000 volunteer hours so far this year alone in keeping our “spiritual home” in great condition.**

Many of the accomplishments have probably gone unnoticed by the weekly church attendee, but I would like to highlight a few of the things accomplished by the Physical Resources Team and many other volunteers this year:

- Landscaping under canopy cleaned up in Spring and “historical rock markers” reset. Landscape along “C” Ave. removed and rock added
- Baseball field agreement with Linn Mar was finalized into a written format for the first time
- A mailbox with doggie waste bags was added to the walking trail, seeding was done along the edges of the trail and repair completed on washed out areas of the trail
- All storage areas and closets in the church have been cleaned out and reorganized
- Countless hours have been volunteered to update lighting and electrical issues in and outside of the church
- Painting of kitchen, South meeting room, Physical Resources room and South corridor hallway have been completed
- New window shades have been installed in Fellowship Hall
- Volunteers have sharpened blades, replaced parts, and repaired lawn mowers many times to keep them in good mowing condition
- Weeds have been sprayed around the property and in the volleyball pit. Several loads of sand have been added to the volleyball pit
- Three dead trees have been cut and removed from the property
- Unused and old media items have been tested and recycled or disposed of
- Both North bathrooms have been tiled and repainted to complete Derecho repairs
- Snow fence has been installed in anticipation of 2024-25 snow season
- Finance Office and Pastor’s office have been switched around
- All keys to various areas and entry of the church have been reviewed and documented
- Parking lot has been recoated and striped (not by volunteers)
- A Physical Resources information binder has been created
- The snow teams have plowed and removed many tons of snow and the mowing team has mowed acres and acres of grass.
- The Garden Team has planted, watered, weeded and harvested much great garden produce to share with the harvest table.
